The cost for all programs is \$45 and have a group size up to 10 Boy Scouts. For each participant 11-20 an additional \$2.00 per person is required. If you have more than 20 Boy Scouts that would like to participate, a second group will need to be created.

If you would like to add a zip line ride to any activity at Camp Shaw there is an additional \$5 per Scout charge.

Horsemanship Merit Badge is \$30 per Scout and includes instruction, ½ hour arena lesson and 1 hour trail ride.
